

**BRACELET GREEK MONOGRAMS v1.0**

The Greek equivalent of my Bracelet Monograms: eight fonts that let you create custom monograms or linking text with oval or octagonal shapes, with black or white backgrounds.

**Using the Bracelet Greek fonts:**

1. Install the font like any other. Google: “installing fonts in [my operating system]”.
2. Launch the application you want to use, create a new document, and select the appropriate font.

3. The four Regular fonts have open links on both sides of each letter, so you will need to type a decorative “clasp” first. See your choices at left, keystrokes in red.
4. Type small letters using lowercase, big letters using uppercase. Use the chart at lower left to locate the Greek letters on your standard keyboard.
5. Close the right side of your monogram or linked text with another clasp.
6. Large and small ampersands and blanks are included in these fonts.

3. The four Alt fonts produce closed letters for the left and right side, creating monograms without the “clasps” as the regular fonts above.

4. Type the small left letter using lowercase. Use the chart at lower left to locate the Greek letters on your standard keyboard.
5. Type the big center letter using uppercase. If you’re using a 2-letter font, you’re done. For 3-letter monograms, continue on...
6. The small 3rd position letters are a bit trickier to locate on the keyboard. Use the chart at the left to type the right letter.
7. That’s it! For “A&B” style monograms, type ` or ~ instead of the big center letter.
