



MFC Zulu Monogram Guidebook

The inspiration source for Zulu Monogram is a vintage publication called "Bibliothèque D·M·C: Alphabets et Monogrammes 2nd Series". This wonderful design is an alternative to the diamond shape monogram that dominated monograms at the time. A zulu-shield-like form, this monogram style is now digitally recreated and revived for modern use in Zulu Monogram, with two letter monograms and a selection of additional frame styles for a final classy touch!

Zulu Monogram Styles

MFC Zulu Monogram is only capable of two letter monograms due to its unique design. For those with OpenType Ligatures enabled, Zulu Monogram will automatically type the monogram correctly no matter what combination of Capitals and Lowercase you type.

To create a Zulu shield monogram, select MFC Zulu Monogram from your font menu, and just type a Capital, then a lowercase letter.



MFC Zulu Monogram also has unique frame capabilities, for positive and negative monogram design styles. Using the same formula for typing out monograms above, see the formulas below on how to create these custom frame accented monograms.

Type any number 1 through 7 before a two letter monogram for a variety of open frames - or - type any number 8, 9, 0 to create a black filled frame, then change your font color and type out your two letter monogram for a negative (inverse) effect.

Two letter framed positive monogram



Type any number 1 through 7 and then any Capital/Lowercase combo using MFC Zulu Monogram

Two letter framed negative monogram



Type any number 8, 9, or 0 then change your font color and type any Capital/Lowercase combo using MFC Zulu Monogram
